Mozart's first keyboard sonata in a minor key conveys all the drama and heartache experienced by the 21-year-old composer, who in 1777 was attempting to build a career in Paris. Help and solace came to him from England in the form of a square piano and an old friend. Pianist and researcher Dr Elena Vorotko lifts the lid on the 1785 Ganer Square Fortepiano – a similar instrument – and the stories surrounding this work.

Choral music, chamber works, improvisation and virtuosity converge in this festival presented by the Composition Department. Over four days, explore a wide range of experimental new pieces inspired by the fascinating, complex and playful relationships between numbers and music.
