Luca Zucchi

Luca Zucchi is currently studying for a master's degree in composition at the Academy under the supervision of Helen Grime and Philip Cashian. He read music at Clare College, Cambridge, graduating with a double first and receiving the Royalton Kisch Prize for the highest academic grade for music in the college. He is currently working on a brass quintet commissioned by Westminster City Council. In Times of Extreme Persecution, a reaction to the Russian invasion of Ukraine, and Reflections were the winners of the 2023 and 2024 Clare College Composition Competitions. Luca has received coaching from Robin Holloway, Hans Abrahamsen, Nico Muhly, Huw Watkins and Philip Venables.

Will Harmer

Will Harmer is a bass-baritone, pianist and composer. He previously studied music at Worcester College, Oxford, followed by an MMus in composition at the Academy. As a composer, Will has been commissioned by the BBC Singers, Oxford International Song Festival and Ludlow English Song Weekend, and was a National Youth Choirs Young Composer 2024. Competition successes include the Lord Mayor's Composition Prize, BBC Young Composer and John Sanders Memorial Prize. He is also an Oxford Song Young Artist and has accompanied recitals at Cheltenham Festival, Wigmore Hall, St Martin-in-the-Fields, Oxford International Song Festival and International Lied Festival Zeist.
