CONCERT AND EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

Artists including **Lawrence Power, Nobuko Imai** and **Timothy Ridout** gave masterclasses from 24 April to 7 May.

Royal Academy Opera performed Britten's *The Burning Fiery Furnace* on 14 and 16 May.

The Summer Piano Festival ran from 11 to 13 June. The programme included film improvisation, dynamic multimedia performances and the second instalment of Schumann's complete piano music.

Edward Gardner conducted the Academy Symphony Orchestra in a programme of Mark-Anthony Turnage's *Refugee* and Nielsen's Symphony No 4 at the Aldeburgh Festival (19 June) and in the Duke's Hall (20 June).

On 26 June, composer-in-residence **Anna Meredith** was interviewed by **Philip Cashian** about her career, followed by a performance of new music by composition students.

Musical Theatre students performed *Nine* from 12 to 15 June and *Assassins* from 3 to 6 July. The latter received 5 stars in Musical Theatre Review.

On 29 June, **Nicholas Mulroy** directed the Academy Baroque Soloists in a concert as part of the *Resounding Shores* series, which featured excerpts from Purcell's *King Arthur*.

On 4 July, the Academy Wind Ensemble and Academy Bassoon Ensemble performed concerts at the Deal Music and Arts Festival, as part of a new partnership between the Academy and the Festival.
